STEP 1: GAIN CLARITY - WHAT DO I ACTUALLY WANT?

Before you dive in, take a moment to honestly answer the following questions:

- ▶ Why do I want to move abroad for adventure, work, family, freedom?
- ▶ Do I want to stay long-term, or just try it out for a year?
- Am I aiming for a big city like Tangier, or something quieter like Asilah?
- ▶ Will I be coming alone, with a partner, with children?
- ▶ Is a tourist visa enough or will I need long-term residency?

Be realistic about your expectations:

- ▶ What kind of life do I want to build in Morocco? As a digital nomad? In the heart of the city?
- ▶ What do I expect from everyday life there and am I willing to adapt?
- ▶ What compromises am I ready to make (language, bureaucracy, comfort)?

Our tip:

Write down your motives and expectations – they'll be a valuable guide later when making decisions on the ground.

STEP 2: SORT OUT THE OFFICIAL STUFF - BEFORE YOU LEAVE

Make sure you've taken care of these things before your depart

- Clarify visa requirements (tourism, studies, business?)
- Review and cancel any current contracts
- Secure bank access and cash supply
- Prepare emergency authorizations and important documents (also for family members)
- Digitize all essential documents



WHAT MANY PEOPLE FORGET - COMMON PITFALLS

Passport expiring soon?
Morocco often requires a minimum validity of 6 months – make sure to renew it in time!

Online banking blocked?

Let your bank know you're moving abroad – otherwise your account may get restricted.

Important documents only as a scan?
Many authorities require certified originals – a scan alone is not enough.

Forgot to update your vaccinations?

Vaccines like Hepatitis A/B or Tetanus need some lead time – plan 2–3 weeks ahead.

SIM & internet?

Plan ahead: Roaming can be expensive. Many people use eSIMs or Moroccan prepaid SIM cards.

STEP 3: PACK SMART - NOT TOO MUCH, BUT THE RIGHT THINGS

Make sure not to forget:

Essential tech (chargers, adapters, power bank)

Oocument folder (originals & digital copies on USB or in the cloud)

Clothing for different climates (yes, Morocco can get cold too!)

Cash for the first days & a working bank card

Basic medical supplies (prescriptions + travel pharmacy)

Our tip: Pack as if your luggage might arrive 5 days late - and you'll be fully prepared.

And what if it turns into more than just a suitcase?

No problem! Many people send additional boxes via moving companies, courier services or transport crates. Even container or group shipments to Morocco are possible – and we're happy to help you plan it.

STEP 4: GETTING ORIENTED - FOR YOUR FIRST WEEKS IN MOROCCO

Once you arrive, these steps will help you settle in:

Organize a place to stay for the first few weeks

Plan your first errands (SIM card, registration, shopping)

Identify public offices and services (police, local authorities, emergency doctor)

Refresh your language skills (French, or possibly Darija)

Build connections (Facebook groups, Telegram, local contacts)
